Thai Scholars Fellowship Fund

The Thai Scholars Fellowship Fund will be established in honor of King Bhumibol Adulyadej and Prince Mahidol of Songkla. Together they introduced public health and modern medicine to Thailand and helped to advance the health, prosperity, and longevity of its citizens.

Terms for the Thai Scholars Fellowship Fund

1. The Thai Scholars Fellowship Fund (the “Fund”) will be established through contributions of any amount from any donor. The Fund will be activated when contributions reach \$250,000 or the then-required minimum to establish an endowed fellowship fund at Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. If the Fund should not reach the then-required minimum to establish an endowed fellowship fund within three years of the Fund’s establishment, it will be used to provide current-use financial aid support.
2. The income of the Fund will be used to provide financial support, including but not limited to assistance with tuition, stipends, and fees, to students at Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health with a preference for students from Thailand. If in any given year there are no students who align with this preference, the Fund may be used to support other deserving students at the discretion of the Dean of the Faculty of Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health.
3. The Fund will be awarded at the discretion of the School’s Director of Financial Aid or equivalent administrator in consultation with the Dean of the Faculty of Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health. All decisions regarding admissions and financial aid awards will be made solely at the discretion of Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health in accordance with its established policies and procedures. The Fund will be managed by Harvard in accordance with University policies. The investment, administration and distribution of the Fund shall be accomplished in accordance with University policies, including gift policies, governing endowment and certain other institutional funds, which may be amended from time to time. Under current policies a portion of the amount made available for annual spending may be applied to defray direct and indirect facilities and administrative costs.
4. If, at some time in the future, the designation of this Fund is no longer appropriate, the Dean of the Faculty of Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health may direct the Fund to another purpose at Harvard T.H. Chan School of Public Health.
