THE KING OF THAILAND BIRTHPLACE FOUNDATION (KTBF)

Significance:

King Bhumibol Adulyadej (King Rama IX “The Great”) is the only monarch born in the USA, Cambridge, Massachusetts. The King was born during the family's second stay in the USA, while Prince Mahidol studied medicine at Harvard University and Princess Mother studied home economic and nursing at Simmons College. The parent of two kings of Thailand, King Rama VIII and Rama IX vacationed at Mount Washington during summer of 1919.

Prince Mahidol had become engaged to marry Miss Sangwan Talapat, while she lived in Hartford, Connecticut. Prince Mahidol arranged for Miss Sangwan to stay with Dr. Kent's family in Belmont, Massachusetts after she graduated from the grammar school. Miss Sangwan and Prince Mahidol spent vacation time with the family at Mount Washington in New Hampshire, Lake Placid and the Adirondack Mountains in New York. Miss Sangwan left Belmont on July 29, 1919 to go to The Glen House with Dr. Kent's family by car. Due to heavy rain, they spent the night on the road and

arrived at the Glen on July 30. Prince Mahidol joined the group later and spent time with Miss Sangwan at Peabody River and Glen Ellis Falls.

On Monday, August 11, the family went up Mount Washington by horse-drawn buggy, drove to the Halfway House and walked up to the peak, 1,917 meters (6,288 feet) high. They stayed overnight at the Summit House on the top of the mountain. On the next day, they hiked down to the Glen House.

Mt. Washington's summit has long attracted visitors from all over the world. On August 11, 1919, Prince Mahidol of Siam, Thailand, and his family, Princess Mother (Miss Sangwan Talapat), were guests at the Summit House, a hotel once located on the summit.

The King of Thailand was in study in the United States. Prince Mahidol attended the Harvard School of Public Health, also known as the Harvard School of Public Health.

While on vacation, the royal couple Prince Mahidol and Princess Mother, and their party, traveled up Mt. Washington via horse-drawn buggy to the Halfway House and then hiked to the peak, 1,917 feet high, staying overnight at the Summit House. The next day, they hiked down to the Glen House, a second hotel once located at the base of Mt. Washington.

The son of King Chulalongkorn and Queen Saovabha, Prince Mahidol would go on to become the father of our King of Thailand, King Vajiralongkorn Bhumibol Adyadej, known as the "Father of Modern Thailand" in Thailand, but also widely for his lasting role in the development of medical education and public health in his home country, including his involvement in establishing an agreement between the Thai government and the Rockefeller Foundation to expand medical training and facilities in Thailand.

THE GLEN HOUSE
 GREENS GRANT, NEW HAMPSHIRE

This is the site of the Glen House. Continuing with a long history of hospitality here in the Glen, this third hotel of the same name was a 40 room summer hotel opened in 1901 and destroyed by fire in 1924. The Glen House was one of the New England's most popular resorts in the Mount Washington area.

Prince Mahidol of Siam and Princess Mother (Miss Sangwan Talapat) stayed at this hotel with Dr. Kent's family on vacation from July 30 to August 20, 1919 while they were engaged.

Prince Mahidol was studying Public Health at School of Public Health of Harvard University and Massachusetts Institute of Technology. Prince Mahidol, the first Thai royal to study in the USA, was a son of King Chulalongkorn and Queen Saovabha and was the father of the two Kings, Rama IX and Rama X.
